The vacuum created by the departure of Tewa Coordinator in May, has been creatively filled in by creating a shared leadership structure that has been fulfilled by promoting Tewa Programme Manager **Deepak Dewan** and by recruiting **Janaki Shah** who comes in with the added skills of the senior management level of the corporate world. On behalf of the Tewa family, I extend our warm welcome to both.

These transitions despite being challenging were luckily smooth. For this I want to commend the staff, our allies, supporters, the Board and particularly the office bearers. However, **Founder Rita Thapa**'s additional support in professional backstopping of the staff team was critical. My two colleagues, **IPP Meera Jyoti** and **VP Maggie Shah** also require special mention for their dedicated and unflinching support. Two remarkable efforts this year that are ongoing at Tewa, is the decision to designate a minimum of 20% of the grant-making money to peace work/ initiatives, and at the initiative of the Land and Building Coordinators, to attempt to raise 80 lakh rupees for the Tewa building from local donors! Though we have already met 40% of our goal in this area, we will need your continued support.

This is not an easy time for our grantees to do the work they do in over 51 districts, and neither is it easy for our local donors to give so generously. Yet, we have proof that both have excelled in their doing and giving – the Tewa building is a standing monument to demonstrate this. As an organization, we can only continue to pledge our commitment to equitable development and to lasting peace. Though this publication is a change from our previous ones, we hope you will get no less informed on our activities in an ongoing way.

I feel privileged to be doing this work, and I humbly thank each one of you for walking along with us.

Year in Review

Grant-making

During the fiscal year Tewa awarded thirty-four grants. The Board made a decision to set aside 20% of the annual grant-making budget for "Peace Building Initiatives". The on-going political problems in the country, has placed even more strain on women, especially in rural Nepal. The decision to set aside grant for peace initiative is timely and appropriate Under this new category, a grant was awarded for displaced youths for the skill development and trauma counselling programme.

Fund raising

Sheetal Shakya-Bajracharya "2001 Volunteer Award" winner was inducted as Fund Raising Officer.

Despite slow down in the national economy, Tewa kept up the local fund raising activities. New fund raising ideas were tried this year. The "Peace Light", "American BBQ", and "Special Building Fund-raising Lunch" were some of the high-lights of the year. While some of the effective fund raising activities like "Walk-a-thon", "Raffle" and "Khutruke (Piggy bank)" were retained and continued.

Tewa received support from Mamacash, Holland for "Innovative Local Resource Mobilization". Under this project we conducted the Peace Light. Unfortunately after twice postponing the planned "Mega-event for youth" due to the current political strikes, arson, and curfew following the murder of twelve Nepalis in Iraq and security concern, we eventually changed the mega-event programme to the "Special Tewa Building Fund-raising Lunch". This programme consisted of a series of events organized with the aim to


